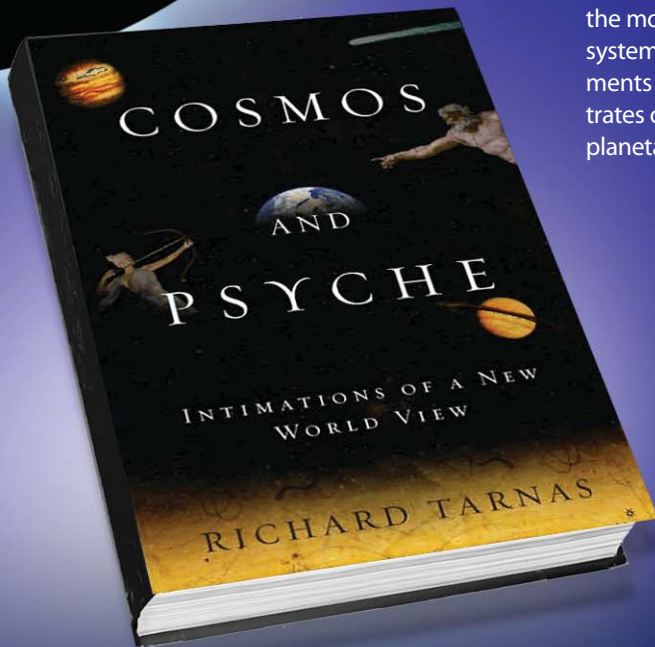

## **Jung, Cosmology, and the Transformation of the Modern Self**

"Cosmos" and "psyche" seem poles apart, extremes of outer and inner, objective and subjective. Yet developments in both science and depth psychology reveal that they are deeply entwined. Drawing on insights of Jung and others, Tarnas explores the evolution of the modern view of world and self, which has influenced everything from contemporary religion and psychotherapy to U.S. foreign policy and the global ecological crisis.

## **Cosmos and Psyche: Intimations of a New World View**

**SUNDAY, APRIL 20, 2008, 9:30 to 4 p.m.**

Richard Tarnas' prize-winning book *Cosmos and Psyche* goes beyond his acclaimed *The Passion of the Western Mind* to present 30 years of research radically challenging the modern alienated world view. The revolutionary evidence he provides suggests a systematic correspondence between the archetypal meaning of planetary movements and the collective dynamics of major historical events. The afternoon concentrates on correlations between representative works of art, particularly music, and planetary patterns.

Richard Tarnas is a professor of Western intellectual and cultural history and depth psychology. He teaches at Pacifica Graduate Institute and the California Institute of Integral Studies. A graduate of Harvard (B.A. cum laude) and the Saybrook Institute (Ph.D.), he served as director of programs at Esalen Institute for 10 years, where he collaborated with Stan Grof, M.D.(developer of Holotropic Breathwork). Tarnas' *Cosmos and Psyche: Intimations of a New World View* is the first book by a respected scholar to demonstrate correspondences between planetary cycles and the unfolding drama of human history. Co-winner of the Book of the Year Prize from the Scientific and Medical Network in England in 2006, his book inspires a new world view that challenges the current mechanistic-materialistic paradigm.
